
Initial h-sounds





Print two pages, cut out the pictures and use it to play a memory game. After cutting out the pictures, shuffle the pictures. Next, turn the pictures upside down, with blank side facing up. Each person picks up a card and tries to find a match. If the player finds a match the player continues, if the player does not find a match, the other player takes a turn. Play continues until all the pictures have been matched. The player with the most match wins. During the game as you turn the card over also practice saying the /h/ sound. Pictures are: *hand, hat, horse, hamburger, head, hill, hummingbird, house or home, heavy, hair, hug, ham, horn.*

Tricks and Tips for /h/ sounds: The /h/ sound is made like a yawn, but sometimes kids that can't make this sound will make it in back of throught as in /ah/. Instruct the child to take a deep breathe and slowing blow the air out. When the child gets that concept down, have the child take a deep breath and slowing yawn and say /ha/. Another trick is to yawn and slowing blow cotton ball (shows visually how to make the sound).

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
